Major Decisions of 2024 that Transformed India

It reinforces India's commitment to gender equality and social justice.

PM's Visit to Kuwait: Strengthening Bilateral Ties

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi embarked on an official visit to Kuwait from 21-22 December 2024, at the invitation of His Highness the Amir of Kuwait, Sheikh Meshal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah. This visit marked the first time PM Modi had visited the Gulf nation, underscoring the strengthening of the historical and cultural ties between India and Kuwait.



Attending the 26th Arabian Gulf Cup: A Symbol of Bilateral Friendship

On 21 December 2024, PM Modi attended the opening ceremony of the 26th Arabian Gulf Cup as the 'Guest of Honour,' at the invitation of the Amir. This event highlighted India's growing influence in regional sports and cultural engagements.

High-Level Ceremonial Welcome and Diplomatic Talks

On 22 December, PM Modi was received at the Bayan Palace by His Highness the Amir Sheikh Meshal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah and His Highness Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Sabah Al-Hamad Al-Mubarak Al-Sabah, Crown Prince of Kuwait. He was accorded a ceremonial welcome, marking the beginning of key diplomatic exchanges. During this visit, PM Modi was conferred with Kuwait's highest honor, The Order of Mubarak Al Kabeer, a recognition of his contributions to strengthening India-Kuwait relations.



Establishment of India-Kuwait Strategic Partnership

The leaders agreed to elevate India-Kuwait relations to a Strategic Partnership, enhancing cooperation across various sectors. The partnership will benefit both countries and reflect their common interests in bilateral, regional, and global matters. Key areas of cooperation include:

Defence and Security: A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on defense cooperation was signed, promoting joint military exercises, training, and cooperation in maritime security, counter-terrorism, and defense technology.

Trade and Investments: Both countries reaffirmed the importance of deepening economic ties. Kuwait expressed interest in investing in sectors such as technology, healthcare, tourism, logistics, and infrastructure development in India.

Energy Cooperation: The two sides discussed avenues to enhance cooperation in oil and gas exploration, refining, petrochemical industries, and renewable energy sectors. Kuwait's participation in India's Strategic Petroleum Reserve Programme was also discussed.

Cultural and Educational Exchange: The visit also saw agreements to further strengthen cultural exchanges through programs in arts, music, literature, and sports. The renewal of the Cultural Exchange Programme (2025-2029) and the Executive Programme on Sports (2025-2028) between both nations were key highlights

Hala Modi: Strengthening Bonds, Shaping India's Global Future



Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's recent address to the Indian diaspora in Kuwait marked a historic moment—43 years since the last visit by an Indian Prime Minister. At the 'Hala Modi' event, the PM lauded the contributions of the Indian community to Kuwait's development, underscoring the enduring bond between the two nations.

PM Modi said that the future of India will be driven by innovations that will guide the entire world. India will become the hub of global development and the engine of growth. It will be a hub for green energy, pharmaceuticals, electronics, automobiles, and semiconductors. There will be the emergence of major global economic centers in India. PM Modi also invited the diaspora to engage in India's future growth through initiatives like Pravasi Bharatiya Divas and the Maha Kumbh Mela in 2025.

India and Sri Lanka Strengthen Bilateral Ties During State Visit



On 16 December 2024, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi met with the President of Sri Lanka, H.E. Anura Kumara Dissanayaka in New Delhi during the latter's state visit. The discussions were comprehensive, focusing on enhancing the longstanding partnership between the two nations across multiple sectors.

Commitment to Continued Support

Both leaders reaffirmed their commitment to a robust bilateral partnership, based on deep cultural, geographical, and historical ties. President Dissanayaka expressed gratitude for India's support during Sri Lanka's 2022 economic crisis, noting India's role in economic recovery efforts. PM Modi assured India's ongoing commitment to Sri Lanka's prosperity, in line with India's 'Neighbourhood First' policy.

Development and Infrastructure Cooperation

The leaders highlighted India's critical role in Sri Lanka's development through key projects, including the Indian Housing Project and renewable energy initiatives. Both countries committed to continuing these efforts, alongside new projects, to boost the socio-economic development of Sri Lanka.

Capacity Building and Debt Restructuring

A focus was placed on capacity building, with plans to train 1,500 Sri Lankan civil servants over five years. Additionally, President Disanayaka thanked India for its assistance in Sri Lanka's debt restructuring, acknowledging India's significant financial support and role in stabilizing the country's economy.



Enhanced Connectivity and Energy Cooperation

The leaders underscored the importance of connectivity, with the resumption of ferry services and discussions on port rehabilitation. They also agreed on enhanced cooperation in the energy sector, including solar and offshore wind projects, to ensure affordable energy for Sri Lanka.

Digital and Educational Collaboration

The two leaders discussed expanding digital infrastructure in Sri Lanka, with a focus on the Sri Lanka Unique Digital Identity project and other technology collaborations. Plans to foster educational ties and support innovation were also outlined, including cooperation in agriculture and health.

Defense and Maritime Security



Acknowledging shared security concerns, India and Sri Lanka agreed to deepen defense cooperation, particularly in maritime security. They also discussed strengthening efforts in countering terrorism, drug trafficking, and enhancing intelligence sharing.

Regional Cooperation



Both countries committed to furthering regional security and development through forums like the Colombo Security Conclave, BIMSTEC, and support for Sri Lanka's BRICS membership application. India also expressed support for Sri Lanka's leadership role in the Indian Ocean Rim Association.



Official Visit of His Majesty The King of Bhutan to India

His Majesty Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck, King of Bhutan, and Her Majesty Queen Jetsun Pema, along with senior Bhutanese officials, visited India from December 5-6, 2024. The visit focused on enhancing bilateral relations and fostering cooperation between the two nations.

King Wangchuck and PM Shri Narendra Modi held extensive talks on regional and global issues, covering sectors such as trade, infrastructure, energy, and socio-economic development. Discussions highlighted the robust partnership between India and Bhutan, marked by mutual understanding, trust, and shared goals.

Commitment to Socio-Economic Development: PM Modi reaffirmed India's unwavering support for Bhutan's socio-economic development, emphasizing India's commitment to assisting Bhutan through its 13th Five Year Plan (2024-29) and the Economic Stimulus Programme.

Women SHGs :Lakhpati Didi & NAMO Drone Didi -A Lakhpati Didi is a member of a SHG whose household earns an annual income exceeding Rs. 1,00,000, with an average monthly income of Rs. 10,000 or more. The Nammo Drone Didi scheme empowers women-led SHGs by providing them with drones for agricultural services, such as applying fertilizers and pesticides. The initiative aims to benefit 15,000 SHGs.

India's --- Humanitarian Missions

India Sends Humanitarian Assistance to Lesotho



In a significant gesture of solidarity, India has dispatched a consignment of 1,000 metric tons of rice from Nhava Sheva Port to Lesotho. This aid aims to address the food security and nutritional needs of the friendly people of Lesotho.
