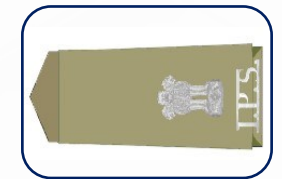

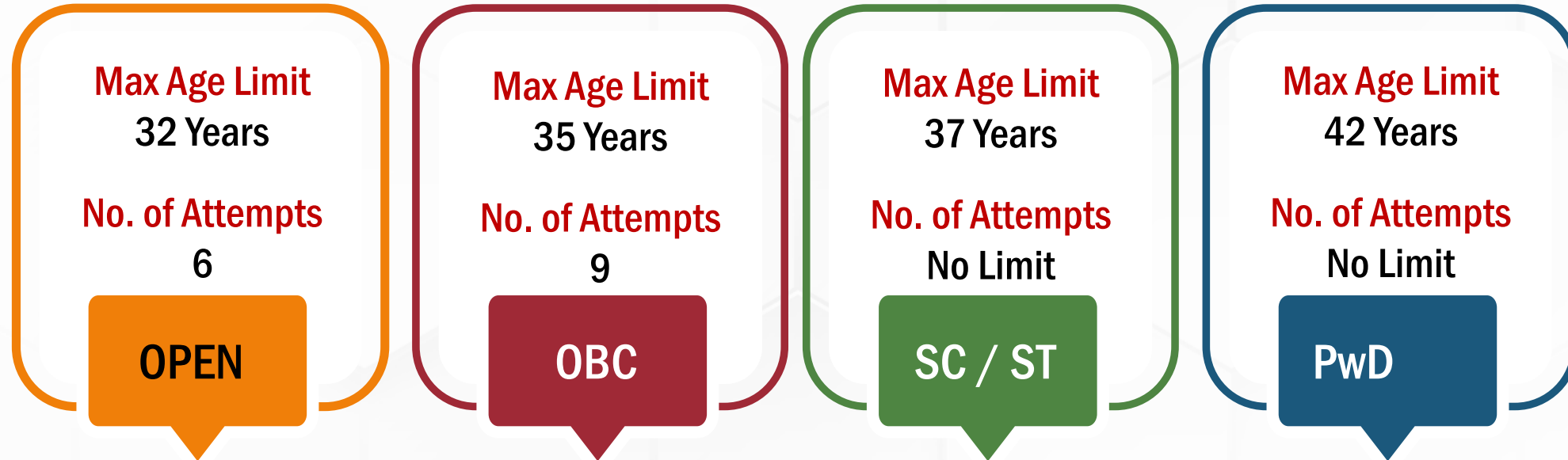

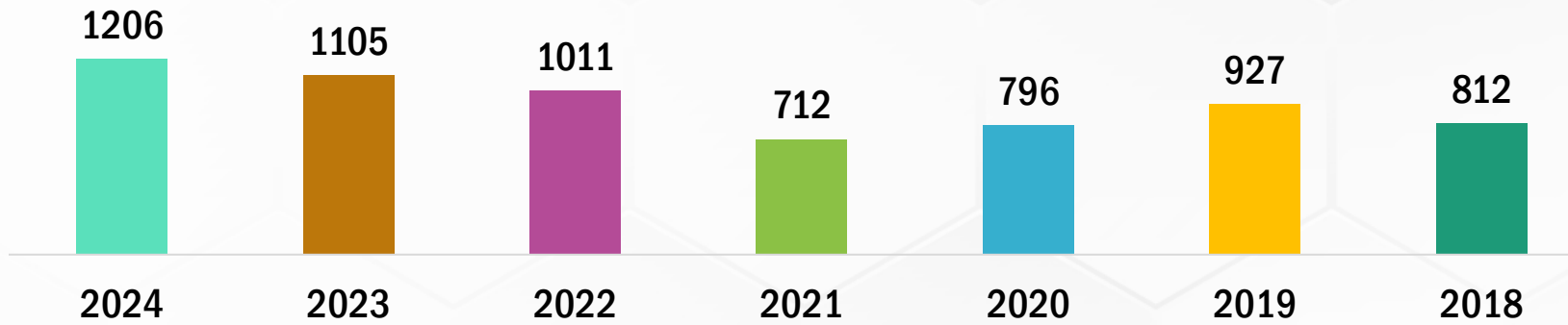

- The cutoff marks depend upon several factors like the difficulty level of the exam, number of candidates, and number of IAS vacancies.
- This would include the Psychometric Test, Assessment Test as well as Personal Interview.
- Objective: to assess the personal suitability of the candidate for a career in public service by a Board of competent and unbiased observers. The candidate will be asked questions on matters of general interest.
- The test is intended to judge the mental calibre of a candidate.
- In broad terms, this is an assessment of not only the candidate's intellectual qualities but also his social traits and his interest in current affairs.

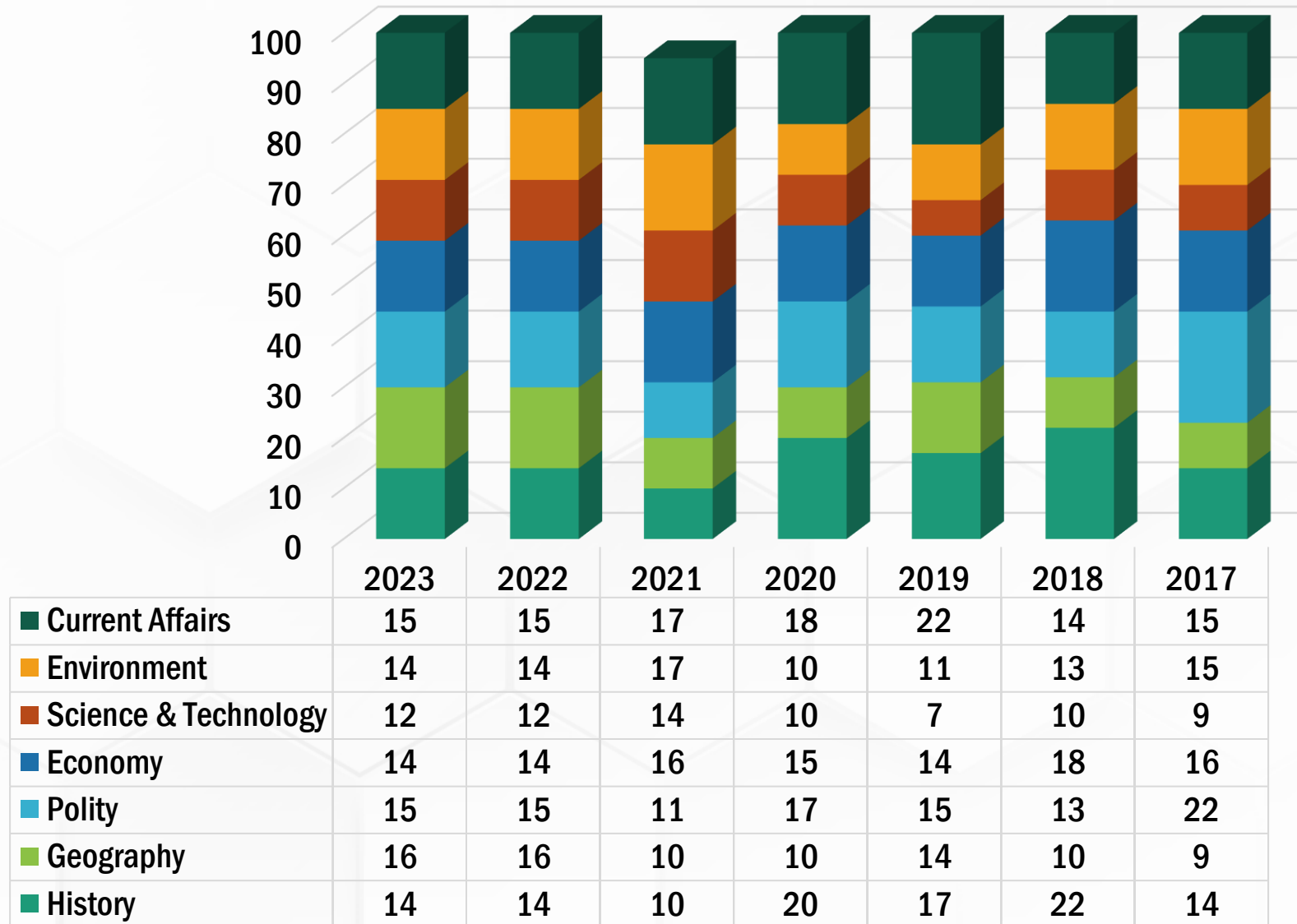


UPSC CSE Yearwise Vacancy Trend

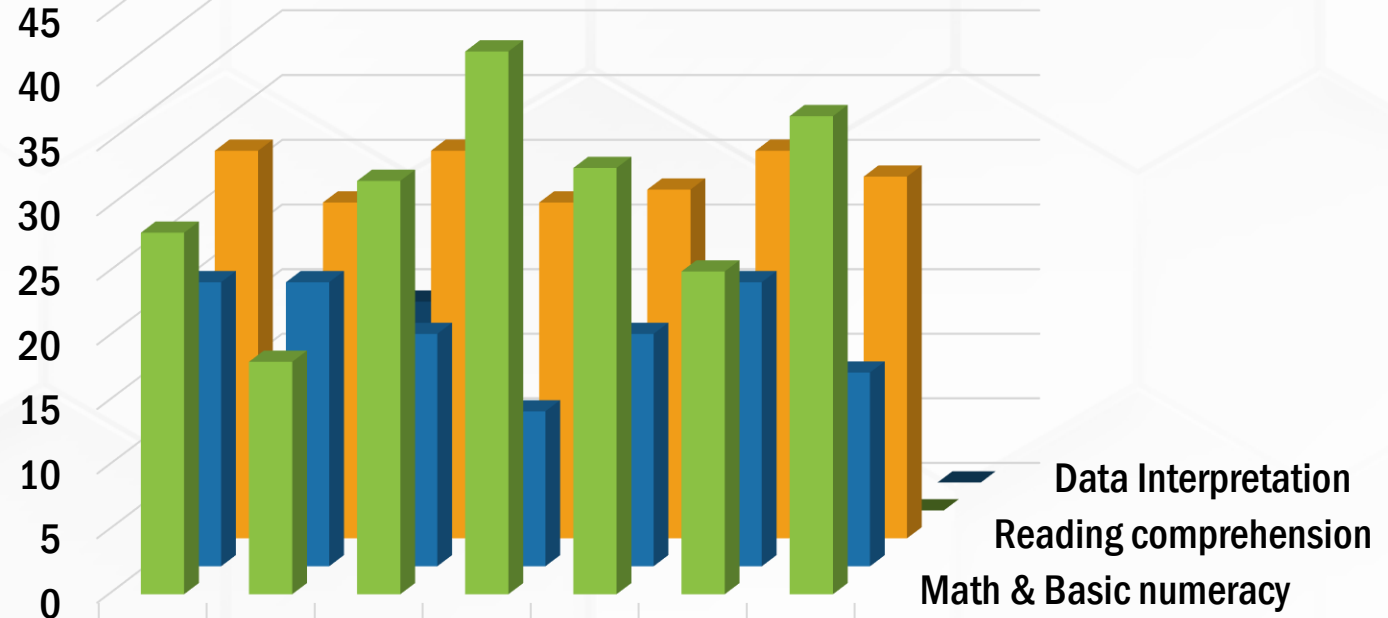

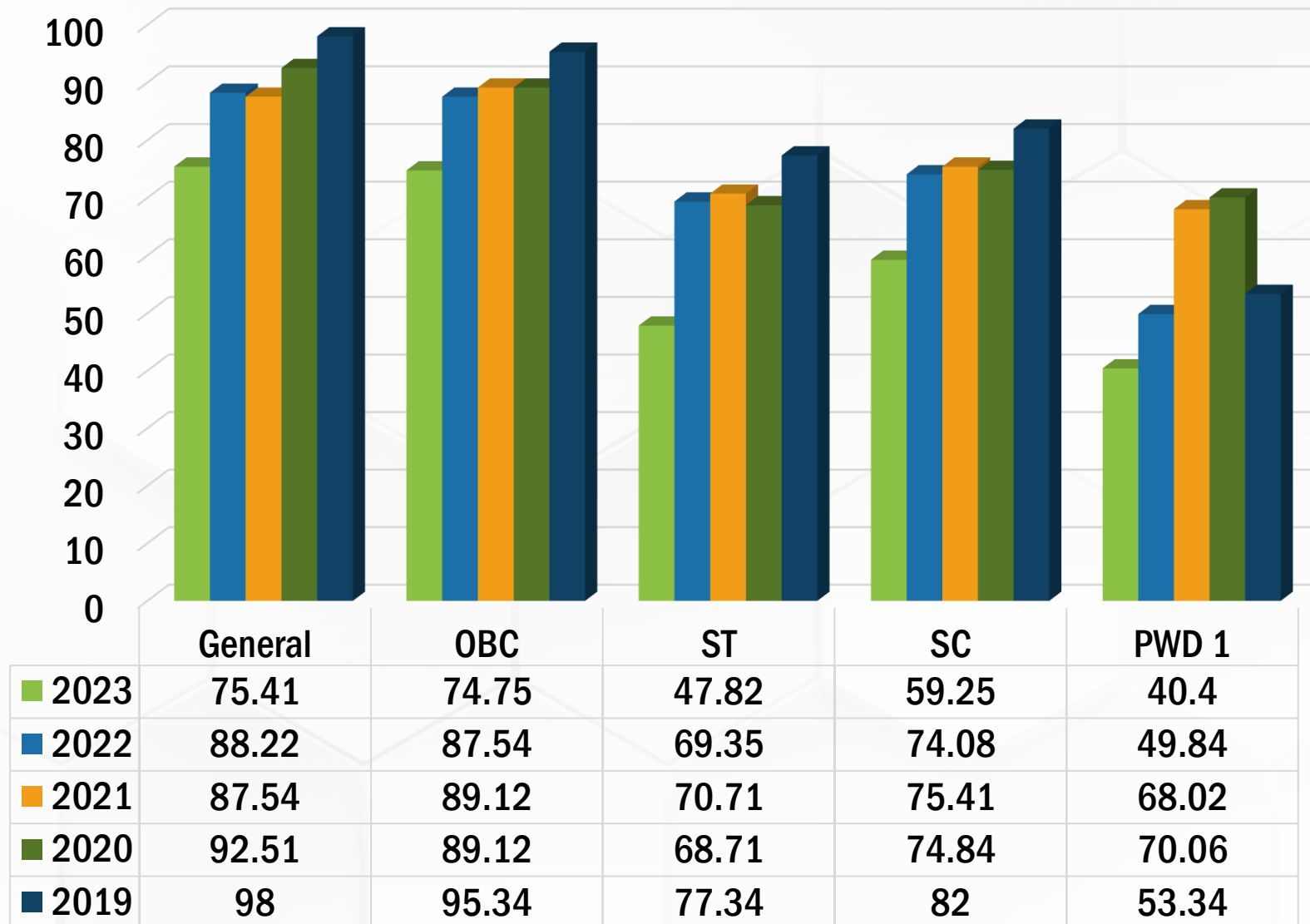
Subjectwise Analysis of Prelims Exam GS1



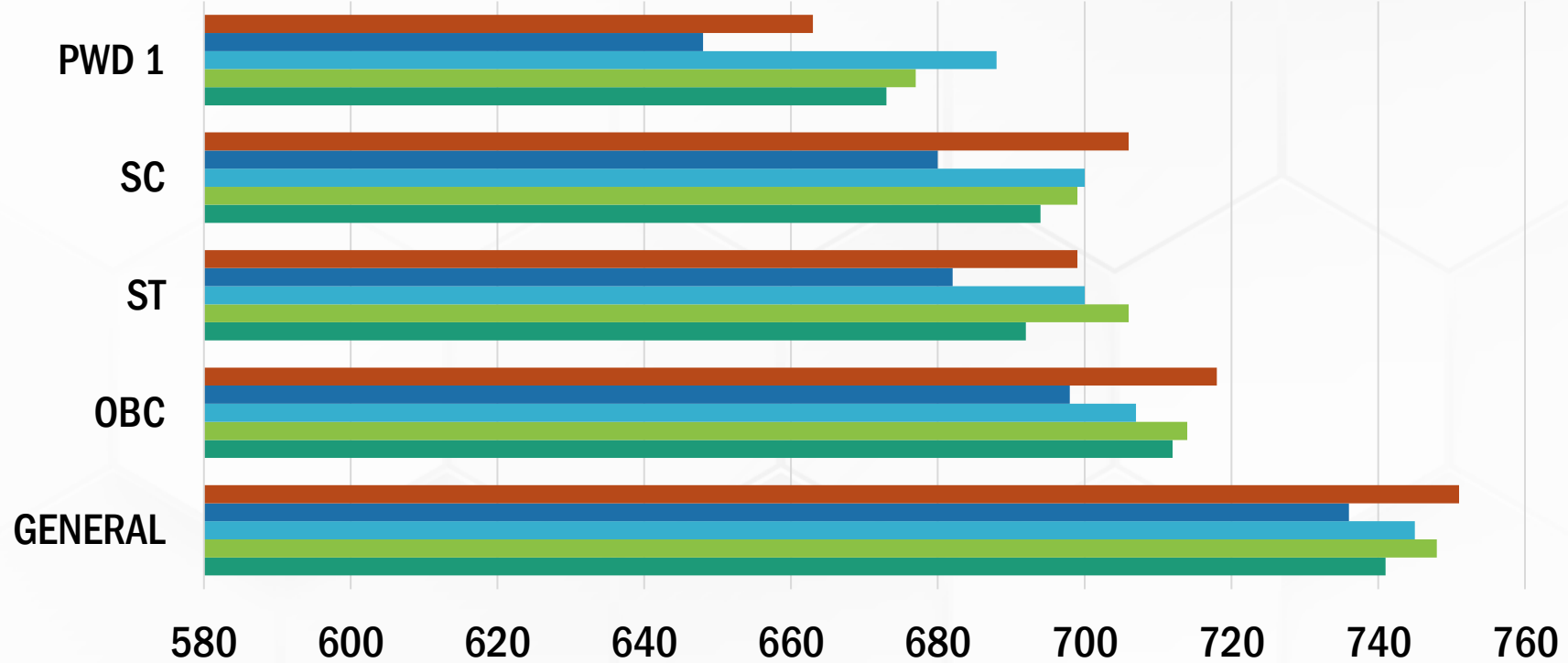

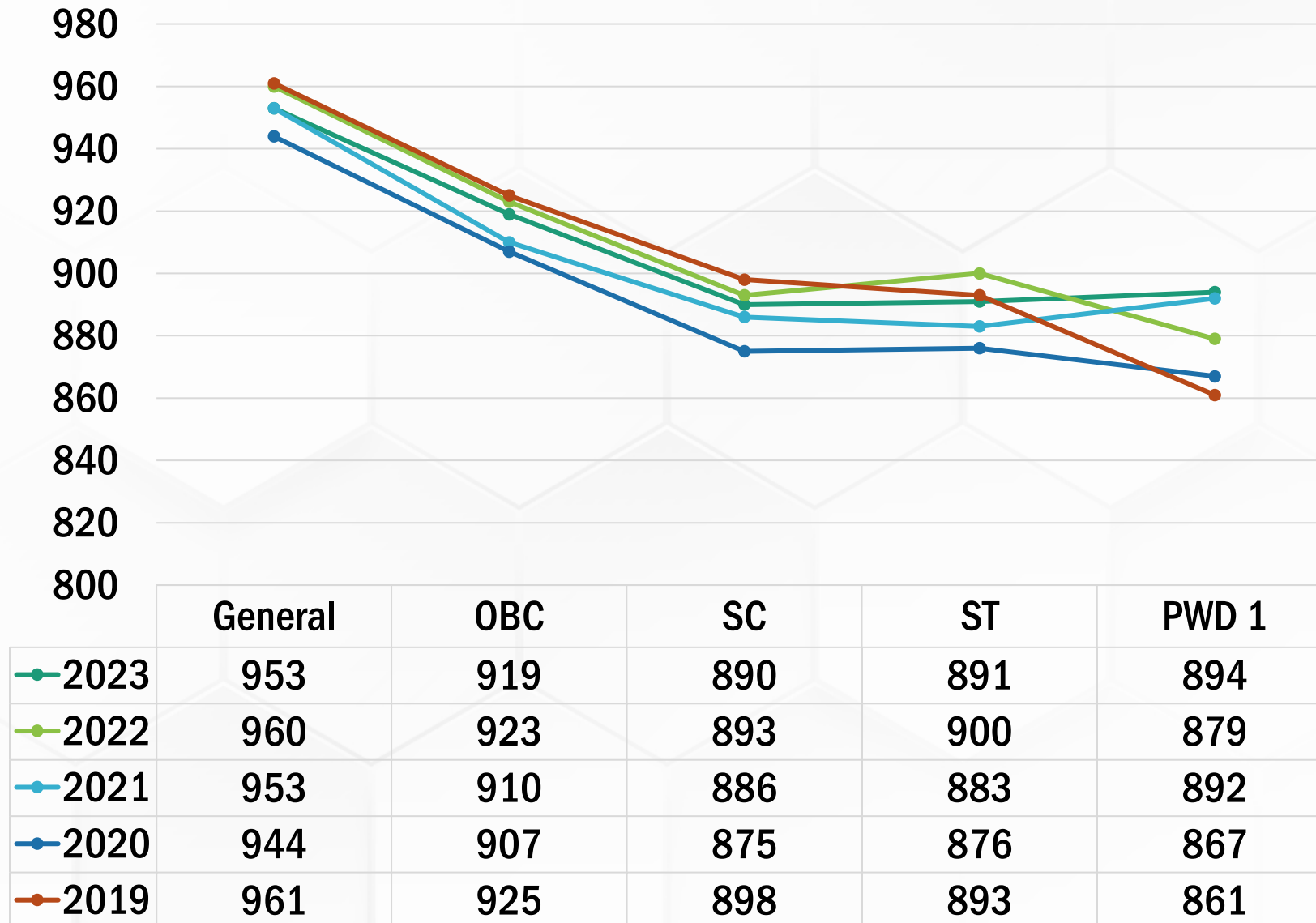


Yearwise Main Exam Cutoff Marks Trend

Persecution of Jews:

- Population and Perception:** Jews constituted less than 1% of Germany's population but were perceived as economically privileged.

This invasion marked the beginning of Hitler's aggressive expansionism aimed at securing "lebensraum" (living space) for the German people.

The Final Solution:

- Genocide Plan:** The "Final Solution to the Jewish Question" was a systematic and organized effort by the Nazis for the genocide of millions of Jews to eradicate the Jewish population.
- Efficiency of Killing:** The Nazis believed that killing the Jews would be more "efficient" than forcing them to migrate.
- Ghettoization and Deportations:** The plan began with the increasing ghettoization (isolation) of Jewish people, followed by forced deportations to concentration camps.
- Conditions and Labor:** Millions of Jews were sent to concentration camps, where they were forced to do labor and kept in appalling conditions.

- In News:** A recent UN report raises concerns about AI spreading misinformation and hate-driven narratives about World War II atrocities and the Holocaust, potentially fueling anti-Semitism.



What was the Holocaust Incident?

- Term Origin:** The term 'holocaust' is derived from the Greek word "holokauston," meaning "an offering consumed by fire."
- Definition:** It refers to the systematic, state-sponsored persecution and murder of approximately 6 million European Jews by Adolf Hitler's Nazi regime.
- Timeline:** The Holocaust occurred between 1941 and 1945, although planning and early persecution phases began as early as 1933 when Adolf Hitler rose to power in Germany.
- Reason:**
 - ✓ **Motivation:** Driven by antisemitism and a commitment to racial purity, the Nazis viewed Jews as a threat to the Aryan race. They also targeted other groups based on racial, ideological, and political beliefs.

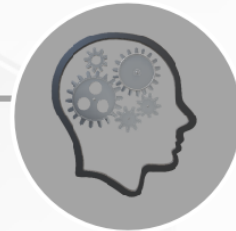

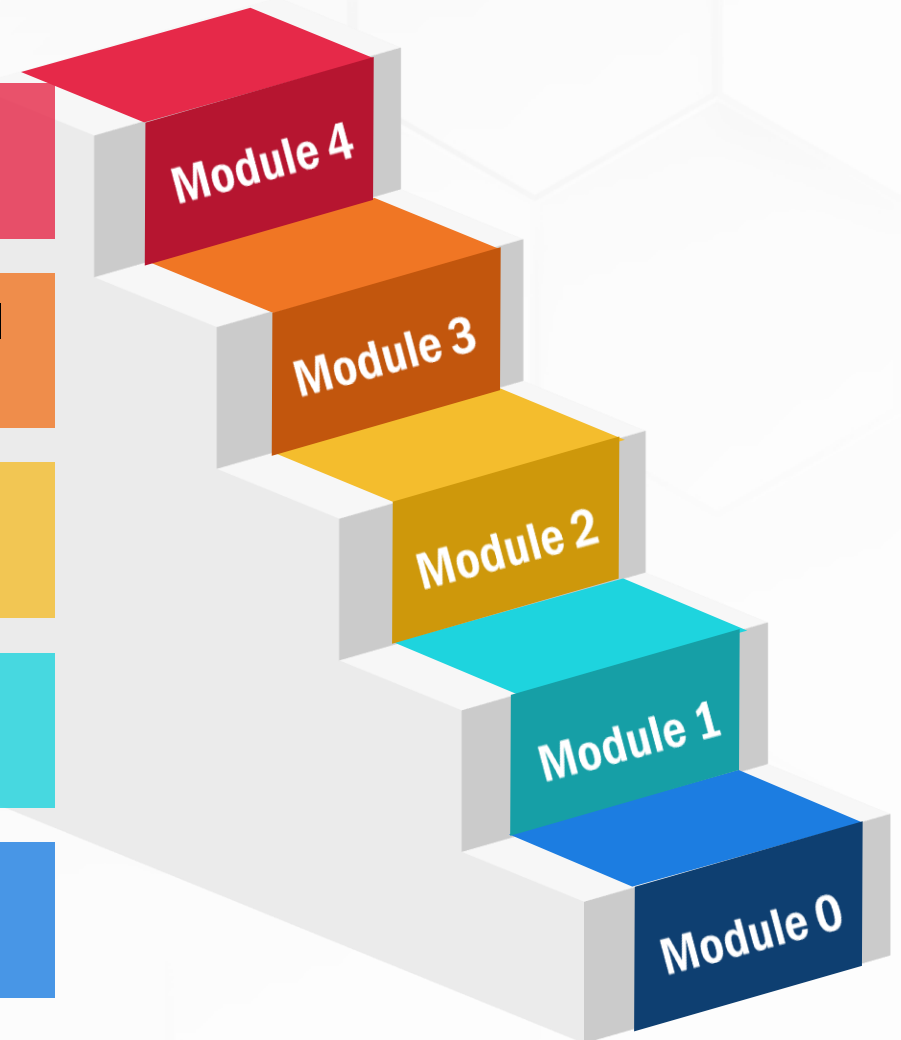

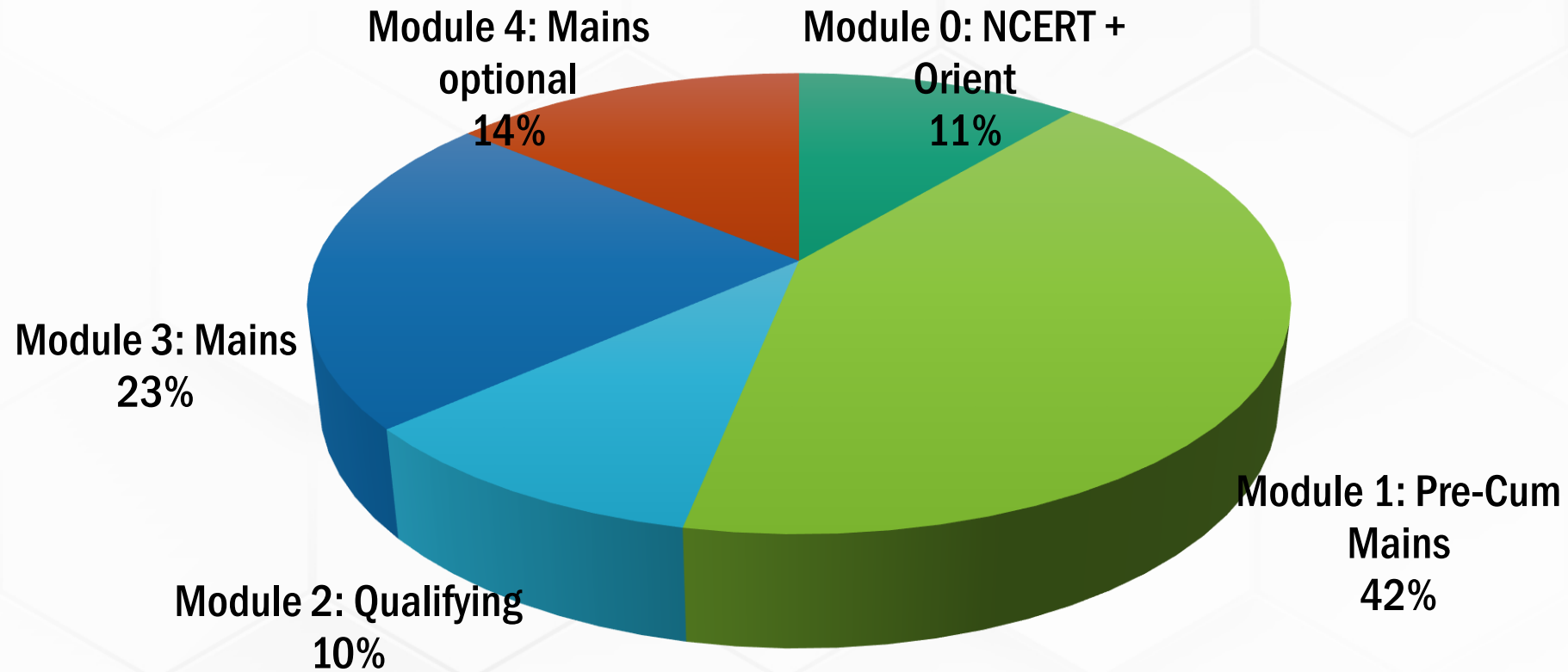

It's good that you have tried your level best to write on 9 questions however, Prioritise to attempt complete paper as quantity and quality both matters!

- The relevance is good for almost all answers written, except for 15 Q16 and part of question 10, Whereby prioritise to write what has been asked in the question (and not what we know)
- The structure aspect needs improvement in terms of using question language to frame headings (this significantly improves the content relevance) and prioritise to address all parts and sub parts adequately.
- issue is read question carefully and align your thoughts as per demand of question and not by what you know. try to read question multiple times to avoid missing out the exact demand of question. Addressing every part is very basic requirement. Structuring part is good, try to break the question well to address the demand of each part asked, not missing any part helps scoring better. Try to address more points in brief and not few in details. presentation can be improved by using short points, diagrams etc. so incorporate it in next answers.
- The content competence is one aspect that deserves strongest attention as there lies immense scope of improvement here. Prioritise to write sector specific key terminologies/ data/ reports and write varied set of points with needed substantiation.
- Presentation and aesthetic aspect deserves improvement in terms of avoiding overwriting (i.e. ~~too much~~). Rest everything is good. All in all it was a decently attempted paper, work on the suggestions given, keep writing and you will do good. All the very best! All the best you have the potential to do better...
